Notes from the Pastor

Best wishes to you and all our parish members and families for a blessed Baptism of the Lord Sunday - and a very good New Year 2026!

The important event of Jesus' Baptism

As you know, we celebrate the Baptism of Jesus during the Sunday after Epiphany Sunday. This sacred event marks the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. The Baptism of Jesus is always a very important commemoration in the Church Year and in our calendar, and this annual celebration concludes the Christmas Season.

In the holy event of Jesus' Baptism, we have several important elements. First, we have the start of Jesus' public ministry as He brings His message and His activity as the Redeemer to the people of Israel, the first People of God. Second, by His Baptism, Jesus shows us that He is united with us in our life - except that He was entirely without sin. Third, the heavenly voice - the voice of the Father - assures all of us that Jesus is indeed the beloved Son of God, the Savior sent by God into our world.

Since the Baptism of Jesus, this sacred practice and ceremony has been the ritual of initiation into the community of Jesus beginning nearly 2000 years ago. By our own Baptism, we are cleansed from the sin of this world, we are filled with the very life of God for the first time, and we become members of Jesus' one, holy, catholic and apostolic Church. Our own Baptism begins our life in God's Kingdom and our journey to the eternal life which the Lord promises all His people.

The importance of Baptism in our own lives

This Sunday, January 11, we remember the Baptism of Jesus and all that it meant to Him. At the same time, we also remember all that our

own Baptism means to each of us and to all of the Lord's people in His Church.

Our Baptism transforms our earthly into holy lives lived in God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit. We are forever invited to live in the divine grace of our own Baptism - and to one day come to the Kingdom that is our final destiny and salvation! This means that our Baptism and our Catholic Christian identity should always be most important to each of us. By our Baptism, we are disciples of the Lord Jesus forever, and the other six Sacraments renew the divine grace in our souls which we first receive when we're baptized.

The Sacrament of Baptism is also important to all our children and grandchildren. For nearly 2000 years, Christian children have been baptized shortly after their birth to share the divine grace of God with them, to cleanse them from the sin and darkness of this world, and to initiate them as the newest members of the Lord's people.

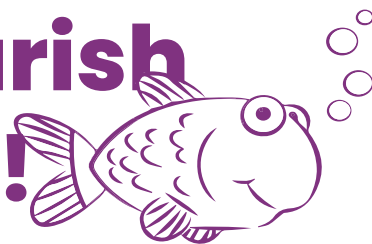
We don't wait until adulthood because all parents actually have the responsibility to make the most important life decisions for their children until they're at least 18 years old. If our faith is NOT shared with our children, they will more than likely NEVER become people of God - and they will NOT share in the eternal salvation which Jesus promises His disciples. We take seriously our Baptism into - and our life - in the Lord Jesus, and we share this treasure with all our children early in their lives for their benefit - and for their salvation.

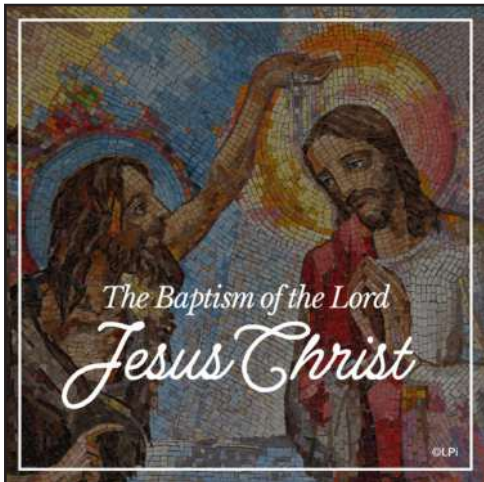

REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: The entrance antiphon for Sunday, January 11, the celebration of The Baptism of the Lord states, *“After the Lord was baptized, the heavens were opened, and the Spirit descended upon Him like a dove, and the voice of the Father thundered: This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased.”*

We too have been baptized. Pope Francis in a general audience talk in 2014 noted that a baptized person and an unbaptized person are not the same. *“We, by baptism, are immersed in that inexhaustible source of life, which is the death of Jesus, the greatest act of love in all of history. And thanks to this love we can live a new life, no longer at the mercy of evil, of sin, and of death, but in communion with God and with our brothers and sister.”*

We too have been baptized. The Father has said of us, *“This is my beloved, with whom I am well pleased.”* Pope Francis reminded us that it is by the **power of baptism** that, freed of original sin, we are included, gathered into, Jesus’ relation to God the Father; that we are bearers of a new hope. Thanks to baptism, we are capable of forgiving and of loving even those who offend us and do evil to us. By our baptism, we recognize in the least and in the poor the face of the Lord who visits us and makes Himself close. **Baptism helps us recognize in the face of the needy, of the suffering, and also of our neighbor, the face of Jesus.** So how do we respond to the face of Jesus?

As we conclude this Christmas 2025 Season, let us spend a few minutes reflecting upon our response to Jesus in the face of the needy, of the suffering and of our neighbor. How is God calling each of us to respond?

St. Anthony School Programs



St. Anthony's is an inclusive educational program for students ages 5-21, with Down syndrome, Autism Spectrum Disorder, and other special needs.

Our unique program thrives within select Catholic schools throughout the Pittsburgh region. Currently, we have four elementary programs, three high school programs, and one post-secondary program at Duquesne University. St. Anthony's operates in a special resource room designed to help students with their academic curriculum. We also provide services such as speech, occupational, and music therapy, as well as job and mobility skills training. 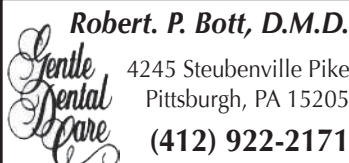
