DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX SURVEY

A PARISH SURVEY DURING LENT

You may recall that in 2023, our Catholic Diocese conducted a survey in every parish to assess the faith and discipleship of each community. In keeping with the program conducted by a Philadelphia consulting group - the Catholic Leadership Institute - every parish will repeat the same survey this coming Lent to gauge how well our parish faith and life are faring in 2026.

This survey is called the Disciple Makers Index. It will be available to all parish members from Ash Wednesday, February 18 through Palm Sunday, March 29. The survey will measure our parish faith, life and discipleship today - as well as the progress of our ongoing parish pastoral planning and growth in these past three years.

As you know, our parish has been participating in the Next Generation Parish Program of our Diocese. Among our Saint Philip Parish developments since 2023 are these:

- Additional Faith Formation programs for children, families, and adults;
- Initiation of our new Ladies of Charity Conference;
- Initiation of our new Mental Health 'Kitchen Table' Ministry;
- Prayers before each Sunday Liturgy;
- Daily Reflection booklets for Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter;

- Prayer and spiritual books offered to our community each year;
- Addition of new Saint Vincent dePaul Conference members and associates;
- Celebration of annual parish events including Mardi Gras, our summer Barbecue, our September parish picnic, our Lenten Speaker series, our parish Fish Fry evenings, and seasonal Bingo gatherings.

Our new programs and events have been added to all of our existing programs which strengthen and deepen the Catholic life and discipleship of all our parish members and families. Our thanks go to all of our members and staff who've helped to develop and further our parish mission as disciples of Jesus and as the People of God!

Every parish member is asked to complete this easy survey during Lent. All submissions will be kept confidential. Only aggregate results will be shared with the pastor and staff. More information will be provided in coming weeks regarding the location of this year's survey.

If you, or someone you know, is in need of a furnace repair or replacement that you cannot afford, there are resources that can help.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) crisis grants can be used to fix or replace broken heating equipment. Applications will be processed in 10 business days or less depending on whether you are facing an emergency situation. **Applications must be submitted prior to April 10** and the grant amounts range from \$200 to \$1,000. You must apply for a crisis grant through one of the Allegheny County Assistance Offices. The closest one is located at Piatt Place,

301 Fifth Avenue, Suite 470, Pittsburgh, PA 15222. The phone number for the office is 412-565-2146.

Some weatherization programs offer repair and replacement services. For a list of local weatherization programs and the services, visit pa211.org and use the search bar in the middle of the page to search for weatherization programs.

For eligible homeowners that live in Allegheny County, but outside of the City of Pittsburgh, the Allegheny County Home Improvement Loan Program offers no-interest loans that range from \$2,000 to \$18,000 to fund various home repairs, including repair and replacement of heating systems. Visit: www.alleghenycounty.us/ahilp to learn more.

Lastly, some utility companies offer emergency repair and replacement assistance to their customers. Depending on whether you heat with electric or gas, check with your utility provider to see if it offers any such programs.

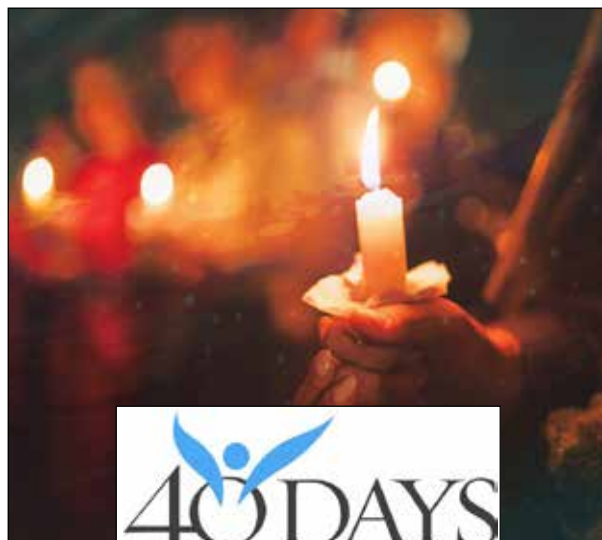
