Notes from the Pastor

Best wishes to you and all our parish members and families for a blessed Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - and a very good Season of Lent!

Following the ways of God

Whenever we purchase a new computer or some other technology, we usually need to begin its use by programming it - or by having someone else program it for us. Then after we receive the necessary instructions and have everything arranged, the device we've programmed will hopefully function well without too many problems.

Our own lives are very similar. When we're infants and young children, all of us depend on our parents and grandparents to instruct us in all the good ways of our faith and life. We don't arrive on our delivery day with instructions already programmed into our minds. In fact, we are entirely "blank slates" who need to learn everything we need to know from our family members. It's exhausting work raising and teaching children, but in the end, it's absolutely necessary. In the end, a very good upbringing and home education will have excellent results hopefully found in a new generation that is also very good.

As Catholic Christians, it's absolutely necessary and essential that the ways which we instruct our children and grandchildren are the ways of God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit - the ways of the Lord.

There are countless ways of life and activity that are found in our society and in our world, but

sadly, many of the world's ways are **NOT** the ways of God. Far too many ways and attitudes in our society today are filled with darkness, selfishness, and evil. These ungodly ways are usually detrimental to our lives and our families. These ungodly ways lead many individuals to disintegration and destruction. They destroy the good that God has made and has accomplished in this world. At times, it seems that the ways of darkness can overwhelm and even extinguish the ways of the Lord in our world.

As we approach the holy Season of Lent, beginning Ash Wednesday, February 18, we'll all do well to examine our lives and honestly ask ourselves if we're truly living in the ways of the Lord. If we see that we're instead actually following the ways of the world - the ways of darkness and sin - then we would do well to pray for conversion in our hearts and in our souls. If we admit that we've strayed from the ways of God, then we should approach the Season of Lent with the intention of improving our ways and redirecting our path so that we return to the way of the Lord - the way of salvation.

This Sunday, may we heed the teachings of Jesus in Matthew's Sermon on the Mount (*found in Matthew chapters 5-7*). May we realize that the ways of the Lord are the best ways for us, for the Church, and for all humanity. Finally, may all of us make the most of Lent so that, by Easter Sunday, our lives, souls, families, and community will be renewed in the life of the Lord Jesus who has given us the true way to salvation in God's Kingdom.



Every year, each parish is asked to raise an extra 11% of its income received during the previous year. This extra 11% is our annual Parish Appeal Goal.


For 2026, our Parish Appeal Goal for Saint Philip Parish is again [\\$126,559](#).

What I have, I give!



As Lent approaches, the Church reminds us of its discipline of fast, abstinence, and penance.

1. Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstaining from meat. All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence in the U.S.
2. Abstinence (no meat) begins at age 14. Fasting (one full meal, two lighter meals) is required of those 18-59.
3. Those with medical conditions which make fasting harmful are excused but should choose another form of penance or charity.
4. Minors are not bound by these laws, but pastors and parents should teach them the meaning of penance and encourage age-appropriate practices.
5. All the faithful are encouraged to take on additional acts of penance and charity during Lent.
6. Dispensations from Friday abstinence are rarely granted; social events are not sufficient reason.




Ash Wednesday, February 18 is this week, and we're gearing up for the Saint Philip Parish Annual Lenten Fish Fry!

DISCIPLE MAKER INDEX SURVEY

A PARISH SURVEY DURING LENT

You may recall that in 2023, our Catholic Diocese conducted a survey in every parish to assess the faith and discipleship of each community. In keeping with the program conducted by a Philadelphia consulting group - the Catholic Leadership Institute - every parish will repeat the same survey this coming Lent to gauge how well our parish faith and life are faring in 2026.

This survey is called the Disciple Makers Index. It will be available to all parish members from Ash Wednesday, February 18 through Palm Sunday, March 29. The survey will measure our parish faith, life and discipleship today - as well as the progress of our ongoing parish pastoral planning and growth in these past three years.

As you know, our parish has been participating in the Next Generation Parish Program of our Diocese. Among our Saint Philip Parish developments since 2023 are these:

- Additional Faith Formation programs for children, families, and adults;
- Initiation of our new Ladies of Charity Conference;
- Initiation of our new Mental Health 'Kitchen Table' Ministry;
- Prayers before each Sunday Liturgy;
- Daily Reflection booklets for Advent and Christmas, Lent and Easter;

- Prayer and spiritual books offered to our community each year;
- Addition of new Saint Vincent dePaul Conference members and associates;
- Celebration of annual parish events including Mardi Gras, our summer Barbecue, our September parish picnic, our Lenten Speaker series, our parish Fish Fry evenings, and seasonal Bingo gatherings.

Our new programs and events have been added to all of our existing programs which strengthen and deepen the Catholic life and discipleship of all our parish members and families. Our thanks go to all of our members and staff who've helped to develop and further our parish mission as disciples of Jesus and as the People of God!

Every parish member is asked to complete this easy survey during Lent. All submissions will be kept confidential. Only aggregate results will be shared with the pastor and staff. More information will be provided in coming weeks regarding the location of this year's survey.

For the first week of Lent, you can shop for the suggested breakfast foods, which

are cereal, instant oatmeal, jelly, peanut butter and canned fruit.


