Notes from the **Pastor**

Welcome to our celebration of the Lord's Day this Sunday as we come to the Season of Lent during our Jubilee Holy Year 2025!

Protecting our souls and ourselves

I tend to think that most Christians are raised to be trusting of others - especially in our personal relationships. We have been raised to believe that others are honest and good that others want to be true and faithful disciples of Jesus just as we want to be.

Unfortunately, more than a few people think that being "trusting" is simply being "naïve." They trust no one and think that most people are deceptive and dishonest. They think that we who are trusting individuals are all too often are misled and swindled.

Those people with such a negative evaluation of others have an unfortunate view, but they may have a point to which we should pay attention. That point is that we need to be aware of what is truly going on in our lives, our community, and our society.

In particular, I believe that we all need to be mindful of the messages, images, and activities found throughout our society today which are anything but Christian. Related to the temptations that Jesus experienced in His personal life, we too find temptations all around us every day. Following Jesus' example in today's Gospel reading, we need to protect ourselves, our families, and our communities

from the toxic and poisonous messages, temptations, and social trends that wash over us each day like a tsunami.

Rather than accepting all the electronic messages and common thoughts expressed in our media and our society, we are reminded this Sunday by the Gospel to protect ourselves from the temptation, sin, darkness, and evil that are present in our society every day.

How can we protect ourselves and resist the temptation and sin all around us? This will be a good start: unplug as much as possible! Unplug from the internet, from television, and from the entertainment world as much as possible to avoid being lead into sin and evil. Instead, create quiet in your life and in your home. Read the Gospels, spend time in prayer, and turn your life toward the Lord Jesus and the Holy Spirit and our Blessed Mother Mary.

The darkness and evil that still remain present in our world will harm many lives, families, communities, and nations. Let's not be naïve about that. Rather, let us be vigilant and committed to protecting ourselves from all those things that are not of the Lord Jesus and His Kingdom. Best wishes to you and everyone for a good and holy Lent as we draw nearer to Jesus and as we make our way to the celebration of the Lord's Resurrection at Easter.



REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: As we begin Lent, it is a good time to check in with 5 Things with Father Bill on things to get for Lent. Father Bill notes, "People love to talk about 'giving up' stuff for Lent. This year instead of just giving up, how about we get stuff for Lent."

- **1. GET BUSY.** Often, we think of our spiritual lives like we think of a hobby. If I get time, I am going to work on prayer, or my French lessons. Our spiritual life is the one thing that should be constantly improving. So it has to move up the priority list.
- **2. GETTOUGH.** With our priority list rearranged, when we acknowledge that prayer is not like golf but more like water and air, we need to figure out when we are actually going to pray. Get tough with yourself. Taking time out of the day is going to leave us strengthened to live our day more fully. Surprisingly, the more time you give to God, the more you get things done. Try it.
- **3. GET EXCITED.** Each day when I go to pray, I stop and just experience the silence. It's like slipping into a hot tub. With so much noise in the world and in my heart, the gift of quiet is luxurious. Get excited to dwell in that peace each day.
- 4. GET FULL. The Second Vatican Council referred to the Eucharist as "the source and summit" of the Christian life. Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. Increasing our experience of the Eucharist through daily Mass and times of prayer before the tabernacle or at adoration will deliver an abundance of grace for your life.
- **5. GET HAPPY.** At the end of the day, joy is what we really desire and what God desires for us. Jesus knew this when He told us, "If you keep My commandments, you will remain in My love, just as I have kept My Father's commandments and remain in His love. I have told you this so that My joy may be in you and your joy may be complete" (John 15: 10-11). Prayer is not just about my peace but building the Kingdom of God. During Lent, connect with God and then help others do the same by inviting them back home to church.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL SOCIETY UPDATE

This year, we will be holding our fourth annual Lenten food drive to benefit our St. Philip St. Vincent de Paul food pantry. Our food pantry volunteers currently deliver food to approximately 60 households each month who do not have transportation with which to reach a traditional food bank. We also serve those who contact our hotline and are in need of emergency food assistance.



For the Lenten food drive, we are asking that you donate certain foods and toiletries that we need the most, but we will happily accept any unexpired, non-perishable food items or toiletries that you would like to donate. Paper bags with an attached list of suggested donation items are available at the St. Philip Church courtyard (ramp) entrance and the Ascension Church main entrance. Donations can be returned to those same locations until Sunday, April 13.

We are asking for the following items: kid-friendly cereals, instant oatmeal, jelly, peanut butter, canned fruit, condensed tomato soup, condensed vegetable soup, condensed chicken noodle soup, canned chicken, canned tuna, chunky soups, spaghetti sauce, baked beans, pasta (rigatoni, penne, rotini), spaghetti o's, minute rice, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo and bath soap or body wash.


