

A blessing for our parish community

Last Saturday morning, at Saint Paul Cathedral, Fifth Avenue in Oakland, our diocesan shepherd, Bishop David A. Zubik, DD, ordained nine new permanent deacons for service in the Catholic Diocese of Pittsburgh! It was a wonderful and solemn celebration of our Catholic Christian faith and life and service.

Among the nine new permanent deacons from throughout our six county diocese is our own Saint Philip Parish member - Deacon Joseph R. Allen. The new Deacon Joe Allen has been a member in our parish community for many years. Joe and his wife Kelly and their three children reside in Crafton Heights, and Joe has been active in the parish in numerous ways.

In preparing for ordination as permanent **deacon**, Joe participated in a thorough five year, weekly formation program at the Diocesan Pastoral Center along with numerous pastoral experiences and projects, as well as parish programs and diocesan ministries.

On Monday, October 21, Deacon Joe Allen will officially begin his years of deacon ministry here in Saint Philip Parish. Bishop Zubik has entrusted to Joe "the ministry of Word and Sacrament" as well as "the ministry of charity and service" here in our community. Our new deacon's ministry in the parish is voluntary (unpaid) and part-time as he continues to

participate in the life of our community.

Deacon Joe Allen will also participate in our parish liturgy and sacraments in his role as a permanent deacon. When present at a Liturgy, he will proclaim the Gospel and distribute Holy Communion. At times, Joe will also offer the homily. He is also now an ordinary minister of the Sacrament of Baptism - and he is permitted to witness marriages of parish members when they are celebrated outside of the Mass.

How do deacons present themselves in the parish? A Catholic deacon wears a cloth stole from the left shoulder to his right side - across the deacon's heart. Also, he may at times wear a vestment called a "dalmatic" - a tunic usually having two vertical lines that indicate he is a deacon. In our diocese, outside of church, a permanent deacon does NOT wear the "Roman collar." Instead, our permanent deacons wear some simple insignia of their Holy Order.

Personally and as a community, I know that many of us are very grateful to Deacon Joe Allen for his answering the call to deacon service in the Church of the Lord. We also offer him our prayers, best wishes, and support as he begins his deacon ministry. I know that we're also grateful to Bishop David Zubik for assigning Deacon Allen to service in our Saint Philip Parish community.

Our new deacon is certainly a blessing from the Lord Jesus. May Deacon Joe Allen and our entire parish community be blessed by God the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit as we all continue to grow the Kingdom of the Lord!

Mother Angelica Museum and Catholic Canton

Depart Ascension Church at 7:00AM aboard a highway coach for Canton, Ohio. A breakfast stop will be made en route. Later this morning arrive at Saint Raphael Center & Mother Angelica Museum. In 1981, Mother Angelica, a cloistered Franciscan nun, launched what has become the largest religious media network in the world; Eternal Word Television Network. EWTN now reaches 264 million homes in 145 countries and over 700 million homes with AM, FM, shortwave radio and internet. It all began in 1923 in a small home in the southeast end of Canton, Ohio. Born Rita A. Rizzo, the future Mother Angelica, grew up in a working-class neighborhood during the Roaring Twenties a block away from her parish church. Young Rita had a difficult childhood. Her father abandoned the family before Rita was five years old. Divorce soon followed. Life was a struggle for Rita and her mother. Rita's years of trial were compounded by a debilitating stomach ailment until she was healed by Jesus through a woman named Rhoda Wise. That healing set her life on a course that would ultimately change the world. Come and see where it all began. Our visit will include a guided tour of the complex followed by the celebration of Mass in Mary, Ark of the Covenant Chapel. Enjoy a delicious catered lunch followed by free time to explore the Lourdes Grotto, Rosary Garden and Gift Store. This afternoon visit the Rhoda Wise House & Grotto. Born in 1888 in Cadiz, Ohio and raised in Wheeling, WV, Rhoda converted to the Catholic Church while in Mercy Hospital. Over time she developed a strong devotion to the Rosary and St. Therese the Little Flower. Rhoda Wise would later experience apparitions of Our Lord and St. Therese. On October 7, 2016, Rhoda Wise's Cause for Canonization opened in the Diocese of Youngstown. Enjoy time here to visit the home and pray at the grotto. A special "sweet stop" will be made before we embark on our journey home. Arrive back home approximately 8:00PM. A brief dinner stop will be made en route home.




The contribution for EACH Mass Intention is still \$10, and the contribution for EACH Sanctuary Lamp Memorial is still \$20.



REFLECTIONS FROM MARYANN: I have a friend who last week said that if she ran a television station there would be a half hour of the day's news followed by a half hour of local good news. There is little doubt that the news of each day can be a little troubling and at times frightening. It brings me back to our review of 5 Things with Father Bill by William Byrne.

Father Bill notes that today's news can leave people confused, and worried. He reminds us, "God does not make bad things happen. We live in a world that has been wounded in many ways by our



forgetting of God. The power of the Gospel message is that God never forgets us. When bad things happen, God will always bring good from bad. For us the Kingdom comes when we align ourselves with God by bringing Him into our lives in an even deeper and more committed way." According to Father Bill, here are five ways to bring God more deeply into our lives.

- **1. Create a house of prayer.** Vatican II told us that the home is the first building block of the Kingdom. Make your house, apartment, condo, or dorm room a place where Christ is welcome and comfortable. Decorate accordingly. Always practice humility and forgiveness. Sweep out anything that is not worthy of the King's residence. Saying, "I am sorry" or "Can I help" keeps a home beautiful.
- 2. Take a minute. Morning Prayer should become a common spiritual practice. When you open your eyes thank God for the gift of the day, no matter what the day might bring. Offer the day back to Him, and ask yourself to be an instrument of His peace. Ask God, "What do you want me to do for You today?"
- **3. Recall.** If you are trying to remember something, write it down. Put a note on your calendar that says, "Remember!" Powerful things happen when we intentionally remember them.
- **4. Savor the in-between.** Much of our day is filled with the "in between" or the "not yet." We wait in line, sit in traffic, wait for someone to show up, wait for our texts to be answered. These times should be opportunity. Fill them with prayer. You may want to keep a list handy of the people you know who need prayer the most. Sitting in traffic, lift up your soul.
- **5. Recognize the last minute.** As you are going to bed, thank God for the day. Replay the mental video of your day and recall where God was and where you might not have been there to meet Him. Make a plan for the next day to build on the graces of that day. When you wake up the next morning, your offering is the plan from the night before.














As you know, the three most fundamental beliefs of Catholic Christianity are: 1.) the Divine Trinity there is one Almighty God in three Divine Persons; 2.) the Incarnation - the Divine Son of God became fully human in the person of Jesus of Nazareth; and 3.) the Resurrection - following His death on the Cross, on the third day, Jesus was raised to new and glorious life by the Father and the Holy Spirit.

It's also important to remember the three foundational pillars of Catholic Christianity. They are:

- 1.) *The Sacred Scriptures in the Bible* the inspired Word of God in the Old Testament and the New Testament:
- 2.) *The early Tradition* the Tradition from Jesus, the Apostles, and the early Church that existed in addition to the writings of the New Testament in the first century; and
- 3.) *The Magisterium* which is the official teaching of the Church, its apostles, and shepherds beginning with the Council of Jerusalem in the first years of Christianity and continuing through all the official councils of the Church.

These three pillars are often abbreviated "S.T.M." for easy remembrance. All three of these pillars are essential to Christianity and the Church!

In recent centuries, many Christians have claimed that "our faith is all about the Bible," but in reality, since the first century, these Three Pillars have all been of tremendous importance. In fact, the Apostolic Tradition and the official Magisterium came into existence even before the writings of the New Testament existed. The Bible is of tremendous importance, but the full and balanced faith of the Church includes the ancient and original Tradition as well as all the official teachings (the Magisterium) of the Catholic Church since the first years after Jesus' life, death, and Resurrection.

Take a look at *The Catechism of the Catholic Church* and every approved catechism of the Church. You'll see countless passages from and references to the Scriptures, the Tradition, and the *Magisterium*. We are blessed to have not only one pillar of Christianity but *THREE Pillars of our faith*. Read The Catechism of the Catholic Church AND the Bible, and you'll have the complete picture of our Christian faith as it has been believed and lived in the Catholic Church for 2000 years. God bless!
